

Cookies policy – www.apator.com

What are cookies?

Cookies are IT data, in particular small text files. They are saved and stored in the memory of your computer or on another device that you use to connect to the Internet (e.g. smartphone, tablet, etc.).

How do we use cookies?

We respect your right to privacy. We use cookies and similar technologies to enable you to use the website of Apator Group in a convenient, easy and accessible way.

By using cookies, we want to provide you, among other things:

- convenient use of basic functions of Apator Group's website,
- access to the latest improvements on the website of Apator Group, which we introduce thanks to our analytics.

What cookies do we use?

We use session and persistent cookies.

- **Session cookies** are active, i.e. they collect and store information only for as long as you connect to our website.
- **Permanent files**, on the other hand, are active for a period of time that is predetermined for the file. In the case of HTML local storage, the information remains stored on your device until you delete it from the cache of your web browser.

The different cookies and similar technologies used on this website have different functions and the purposes for which we use them. You can read about them below.

Cookies necessary for the use of the website

Cookies that are needed for the proper operation of the Apator Group website. They enable you to conveniently use the website and its basic functions. This type of cookies does not require consent, as their use is permitted by law.

Cookies to improve the website

Cookies that store information about your visits and how you use the website. We need them to improve the content of the website, to carry out analytical processes and to improve the performance of the website.

We collect information using cookies and analytics tools from authorized third-party partners. We care about your privacy and security, which is why the data collected is stored in an aggregated form to protect your privacy.

List of cookies

A cookie is a small piece of data (a text file) that a website – when visited by a user – asks the user's browser to save on their device in order to remember information about the user, such as the preferred language.

Individual cookies used on this website can be either first-party cookies (placed and used by us as the owner of the website) or third-party cookies (placed and used by our partners through this website – these are so-called third-party cookies). Third-party cookies allow tools and functions provided to us by third parties to function on our website. Through these cookies, third-party providers may obtain information about your use of our website, as well as other websites with which these providers cooperate.

More specifically, we use cookies and other tracking technologies for the following purposes:

Cookies necessary for the use of the website

Cookies that are necessary for the proper functioning of the website www.apator.com and that enable you to use the website and its basic functions comfortably.

Cookies necessary for the use of the website
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>apator_session + PHPSESSIDsession data for basic operation of the application (only for the duration of the visit)</i> first party cookie
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>displayedPopups</i> stores information about whether a given popup has already been displayed (how many times, whether it should still be displayed, when it should be displayed, etc.) First Party Cookie

- **Basket**
stores information about the files added to the download cart, used only until the first party cookie is downloaded

Cookies that allow us to improve the website (analytical)

Cookies that store information about your visit to and how you use the website. They are necessary for us to improve the content of the website, conduct analytical processes and improve the performance of the website of Apator Group. We collect information using cookies and analytics tools from authorized third-party partners. We care about your privacy and security, which is why the data collected is stored in an anonymized form.

Cookies that allow us to improve the website (analytical)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>_ga_*</u> Google Analytics uses it to record and count page views
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>_ga</u> Google Analytics sets this cookie to calculate visitor, session and campaign data and to track site usage for the site's analytics report. The cookie stores information anonymously and assigns a randomly generated number to recognize unique visitors. By default, it is set to expire after 2 years, although this is configurable by website owners.

On what basis do we use cookies?

The basis for the use of cookies is the legitimate interest of the website owner (in the case of necessary/technical cookies) or the consent of the user (in the case of other cookies and similar technologies).

What can you do if you do not want to use cookies?

You can withdraw your consent to cookies at any time, e.g. by setting your preferences in the banner (window) available via [this link](#), by deleting them or by changing the settings of your web browser.

Restrictions related to the use of cookies may affect the proper operation of the www.apator.com website or its selected functions.

You can change your cookie settings in any web browser. Instructions on how to manage and delete cookies are usually available in the "Help" or "Settings" section of each browser. We encourage you to review these settings in the browser you are using to learn how to control cookies.

Data processing outside the EEA

Due to the use of third-party cookies on our website, some of the information obtained by these cookies may be transferred outside the European Economic Area. If information could be transferred outside the European Economic Area, it would only be within the framework of the procedures required by the provisions of the personal data protection regulations, i.e.:

- countries for which the European Commission has issued a decision stating that they provide an adequate level of protection, or
- in the absence of the above-mentioned decision – after appropriate safeguards are in place, and provided that the enforceable rights of data subjects and effective remedies apply, e.g. on the basis of concluding standard data protection clauses adopted by the European Commission with the entity to which the data is to be transferred, equipped with additional safeguards – if necessary.
